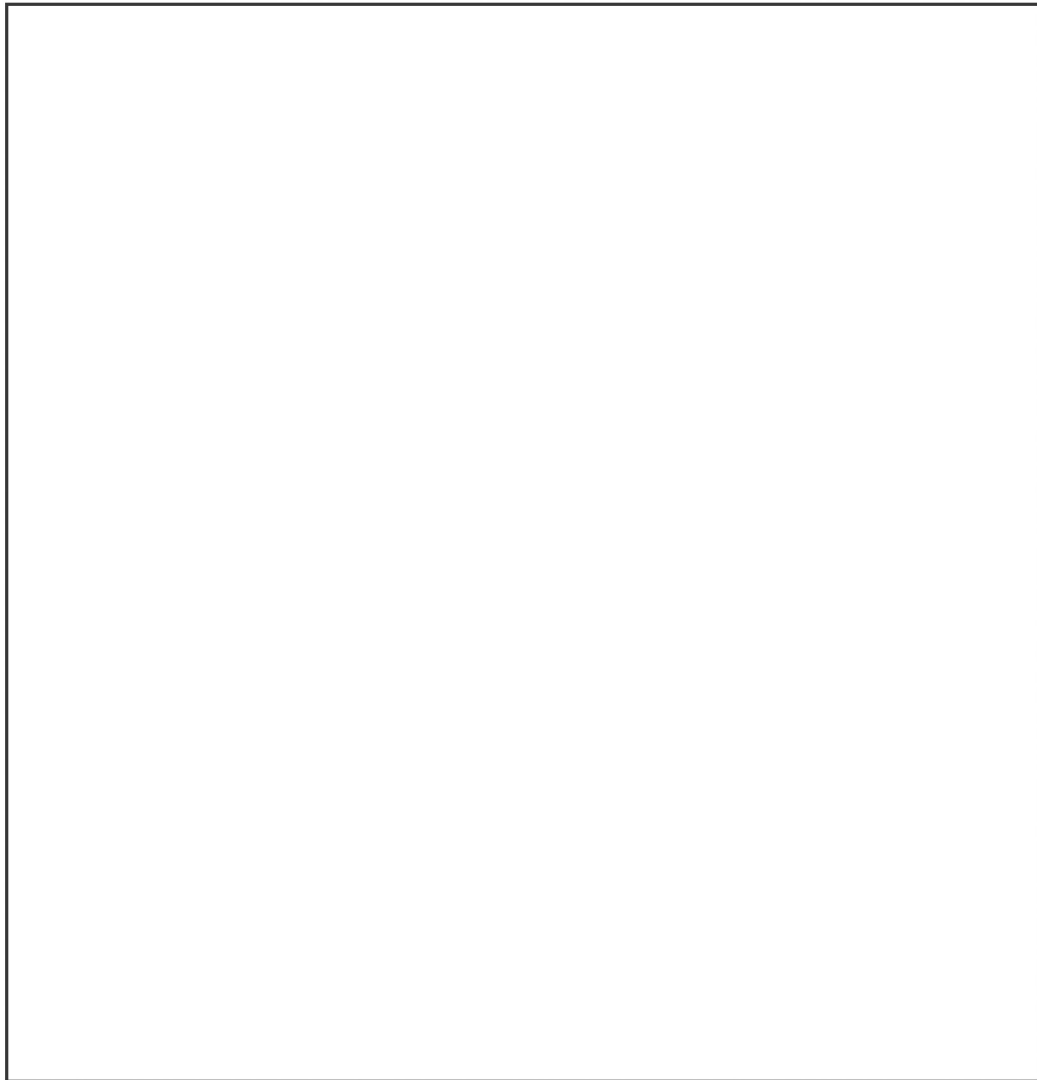

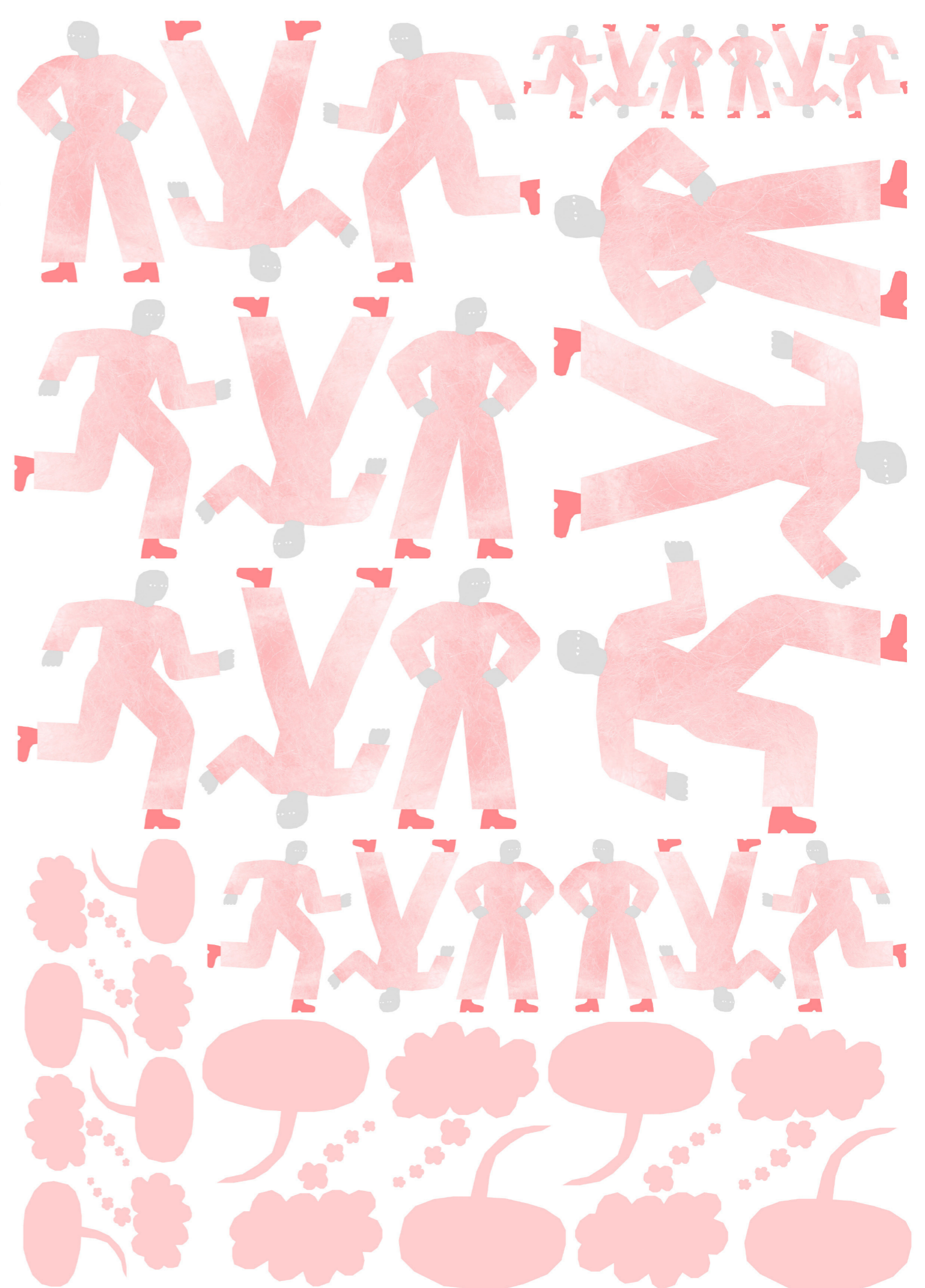
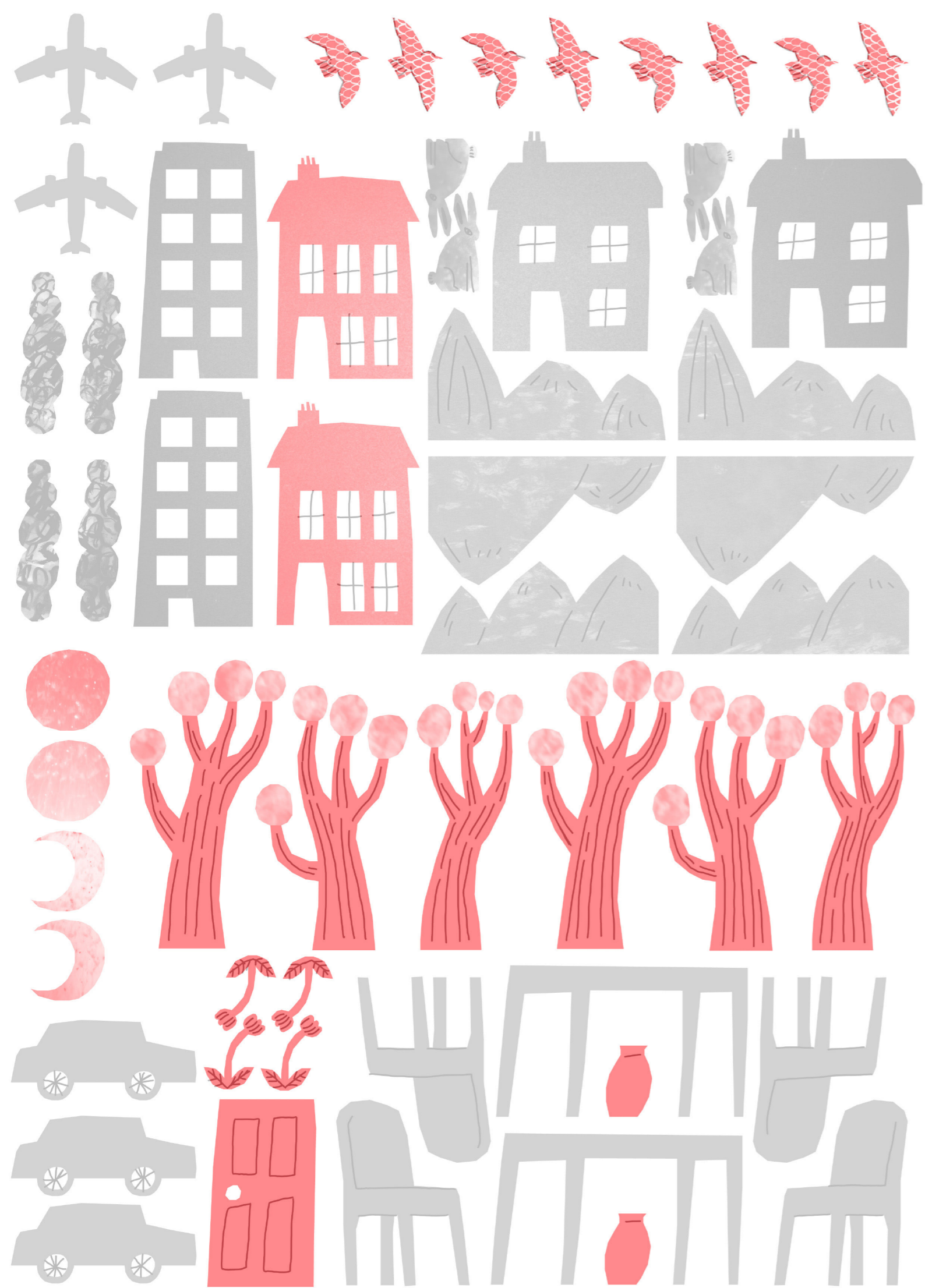

This guide comes with:

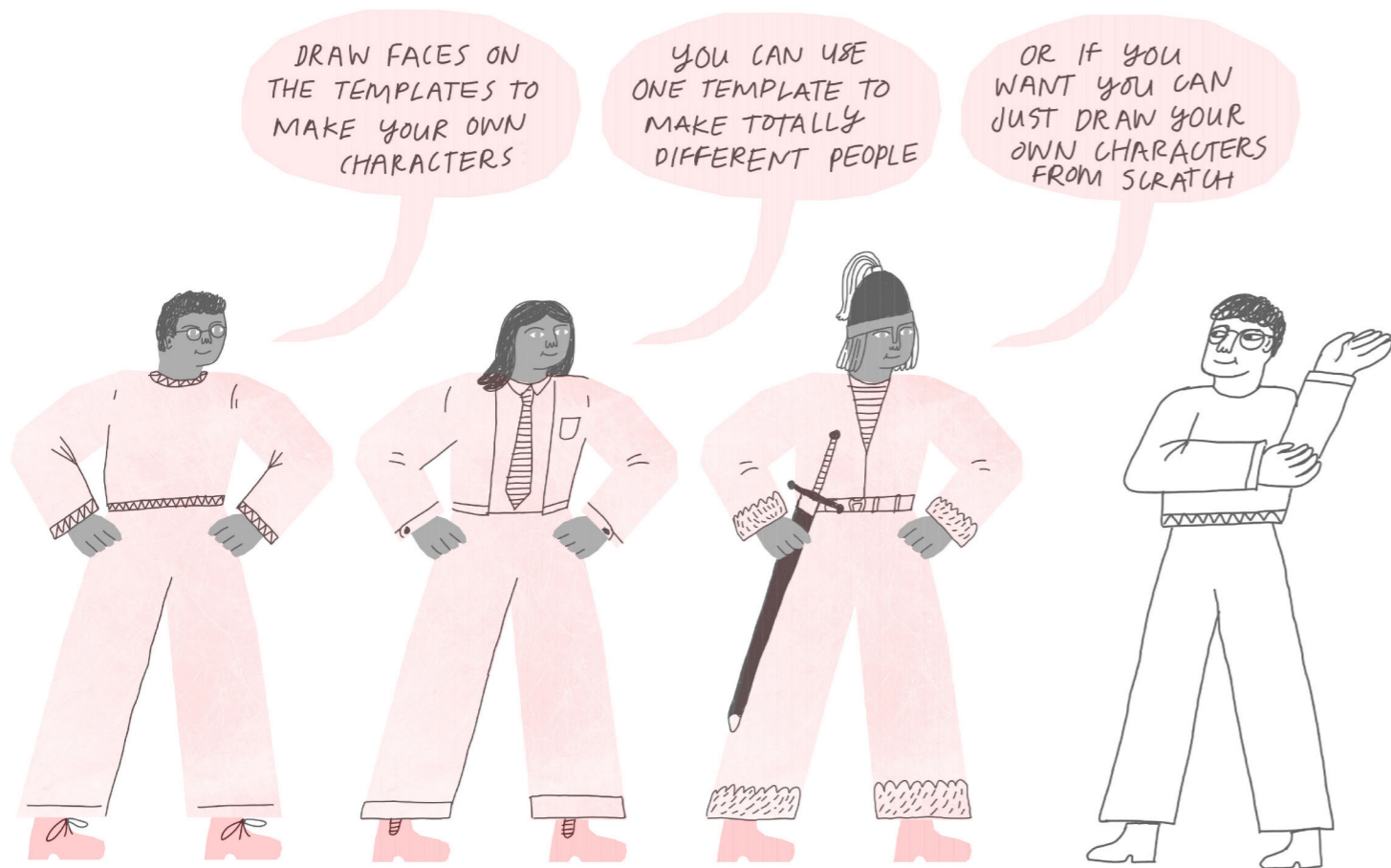
Pages of blank comic panels

Cut out objects and scenery to stick in your comic

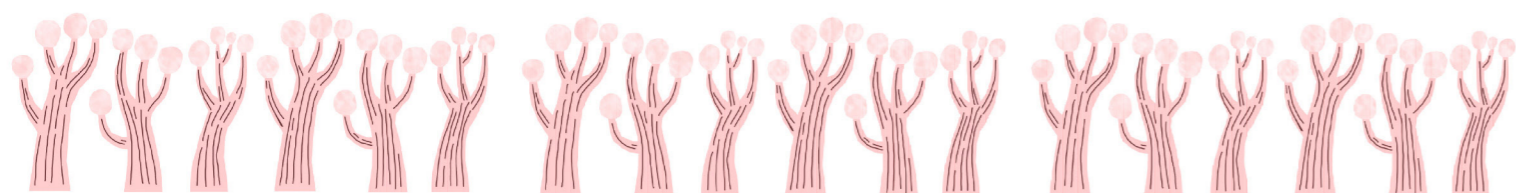
Customisable templates for cutout people to be the characters in your comic

Cut these out and stick them on the panels in any order to tell a little story.

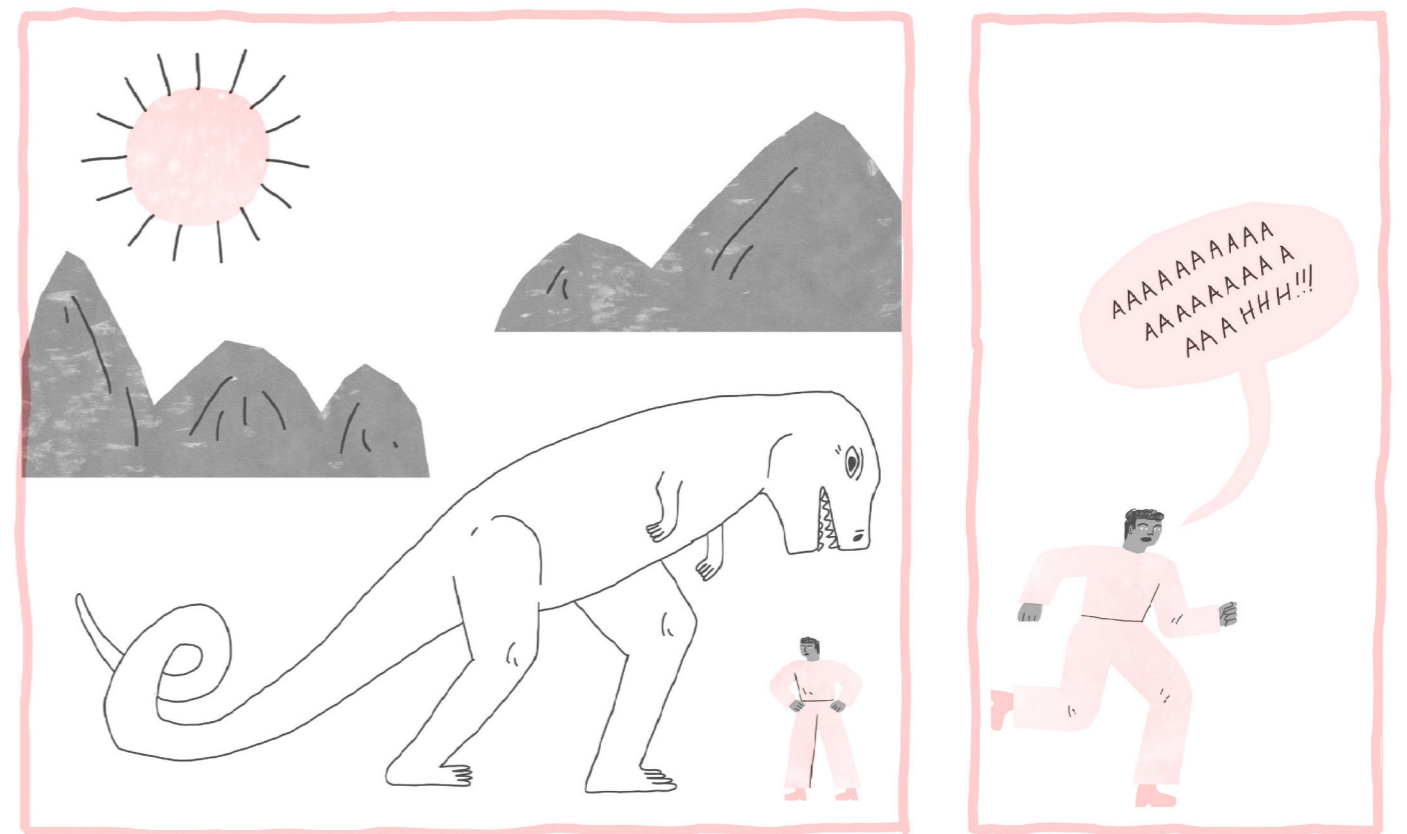
