
This iceberg has been hiding a deep dark secret for 3000 years.

This is a single drop of seawater magnified 25 times.


Please draw a single drop of toilet water magnified 25 times.





Some mad scientists have fed sweets to a group of spiders and it's had a very strange effect on their webs.


Please draw the missing webs.






It's safe to say that David Attenborough is a national treasure.











I. To make your butterfly you will need...



Take a piece of clay and roll a sausage shape for your butterflies body, take more clay and mould some wings.



(make your butterfly about the size of your hand!)




3. Using your finger make sure you attach the wings to the body securely, make sure there aren't any cracks!




4. Time to give your butterfly a face!

Roll some small balls of clay for eyes, don't forget the anttenae (this is how they smell & taste)




5. Using tools or found objects you can carve designs and patterns into the clay.

6. Poke two holes into the wings. Once dry you can attach some rope and hang up your butterfly!



7. Once completely dry you can use acrylic paint to decorate your butterfly.
