

BAD WAXWORKS


Sometimes art goes wrong. Draw yourself as a bad waxwork!

MAKE A KUYCK-COHEN CAT!

In his exhibition *Brown Carpet*, artist Harley Kuyck-Cohen filled the gallery with lots of wooden cats! Now we want you to do the same!

What you need to do:

- 1) Colour in the template of the cat. Go wild!
- 2) <u>Carefully</u> cut out around the lines of the template.
- 3) Match up the letters of the holes on your template (e.g A with A)
- 4) Using split pins, carefully push through the template, to make the joints!
- 5) On the other side of the paper, fold the split pins down.
- 6) Move your cat around into any purr-sition you like!
