




Fantastic news! These two have just given birth to a beautiful baby balloon! But she's only a basket at the moment...

Please draw her in fully inflated form!













This is Max's provisional **drivers license**. It lets him drive a car when surpervised by a responsible driver and displaying 'L' plates.

Please draw a car powered foot:




Please write a poem from the iceberg to the Titanic as it watched it sink.

For this project I'll give two examples for sculptures I have made, but you don't need to follow along, you can use them as inspiration for your own sculpture if you want to make a different vehicle!



## For this bus I used:


A cereal box
Milk bottle tops
Scissors
Tape
Paper
Pens
Paint
Brass split pins

If you don't have all of these materials that's ok and I'll suggest different options!

First I cut out some windows using scissors. Then I poked a hole through the milk bottle top and used the brass split pin into the box to make wheels for the bus. You should ask an adult to help you with this bit.

If you don't have pins you could try using tape or glue to attach the wheels





I put a piece of paper inside and used tape to hold it in place. I put tape both on the inside of the box and over some of the window holes to make it secure - then I drew the faces of the people inside the bus.

I finished decorating my bus with paint but you could try cutting out shapes of coloured paper and attaching them with glue or tape



## The second sculpture I made was a plane and I used these materials:



A milk bottle
Milk bottle tops
Card
Scissors
Paper
Pens
Brass split pins
Paint

Like last time I started by poking holes through the bottle tops to make the wheels. You should ask an adult for help with this, or try using tape or glue instead




Next I cut a curve out of some card, this is going to be the wings of the plane. Once you've cut it out, put it through the hole where the handle is on the bottle



Now the shape of the plane is done it's time to decorate! I decided to make my plane look like a pig so painted it pink and drew a face on it. If you don't have paint you could try cutting out coloured paper and sticking it on with glue or tape.
